AFFIRMATIVE FORM Subject + had+ Past Participle			NEGATIVE FORM Subject + had not + past participle			QUESTION FORM Had + Subject + past participle		
I YOU HE SHE + IT WE YOU THEY	had +	past participle e.g you had decided	I YOU HE SHE + IT WE YOU THEY	hadn't +	past participle e.g you hadn't decided	had +	I YOU HE SHE + IT WE + YOU THEY	past participle e.g had you decided?

Present Perfect: Structure

Use 1: ONE ACTION BEFORE ANOTHER	Use 2: AN ACTION BEFORE A TIME
We use past perfect to clarify the order in a sequence of past actions:	We use past perfect to talk about actions that happened before a specified time in the past:
E.g. He offered to help but I had already prepared everything. I couldn't get in because I had forgotten my keys.	E.g. By the age of twenty one I had finished university. When he started the job, he had already found a place to live.
