Past Continuous: Use

Use 1: ACTIONS IN PROGRESS IN THE PAST	Use 2: AN ACTION IN THE PAST INTERRUPTED BY ANOTHER
We use past continuous to talk about actions in progress at the specific time in the past:	We use past continuous to talk about an action in progress in the past interrupted by another action:
E.g. I was watching TV yesterday at

Use 3: ACTIONS IN PROGRESS AT THE	Use 4: REPEATED ACTIONS FOR A
SAME TIME	TEMPORARY PERIOD
We can use past continuous to talk about multiple	We use present continuous to talk about
past actions in progress at the same time:	situations that in the process of change:
E.g. He was training while I was reading.	E.g. We were receiving daily updates at the time.
They were talking while we were playing.	They were working day and night before the deadline.



Use 5: STORY BACKGROUND	
We use past continuous to provide background in a story:	
E.g. It was a beautiful day and the sun was shining. I was looking out the window as the train left the station.
