- A round of applause: The audience gave the performers <u>a round of applause</u>.
- Break the law: People often drive too fast and break the law.
- **Break a record:** She run the race and broke the world record.
- Burst into tears: When she heard the bad news, she burst into tears.
- Catch a cold: He went out yesterday without his jacket and <u>caught a cold</u>.
- Come to terms with: You need to come to terms with what happened.
- Do homework: The students must do their homework.
- Do someone a favour: Can you do me a favour?
- Fully aware: I'm <u>fully aware</u> of the consequences.
- Get a shock: I got a shock when I saw how sick he was.
- **Get the impression:** I got the impression that he wasn't very happy.
- **Give a presentation:** I have to give a presentation at work tomorrow.
- Grateful for: They are very grateful for your help.
- Go bankrupt: The company went bankrupt during the economic recession.
- Good at: My brother is particularly good at football.
- **Heavy traffic:** We should leave early because there is heavy traffic.
- Interested in: He is very interested in Greek History.
- **Keep a promise:** He <u>kept his promise</u> and didn't tell anyone.
- **Keep calm:** She always <u>keeps calm</u> under pressure.
- **Listen to:** I like <u>listening to</u> the radio in the morning.
- Make a mistake: it's easy to make a mistake if you don't pay attention.
- Make an effort: if you make an effort you will pass the exam.
- Make a mess: the children <u>made a mess</u> in the living room.
- Pay attention: You should pay attention to what your parents say.
- Satisfied with: She was satisfied with my apology.
- Save time: You can <u>save time</u> by taking this shortcut.
- Take your time: Don't worry. Take your time. I'm not in a rush.
- Vaguely remember: I <u>vaguely remember</u> that that episode.
- Wait for: I've been waiting for the bus for thirty minutes.
