Past Simple: Structure

Use 1: COMPLETED ACTIONS	Use 2: FINISHED TIME FRAMES
We use past simple to talk about completed actions in the past:	We use past simple to talk about finished time frames:
E.g. He won the first game. She saw him getting on the bus.	E.g. I saw him five minutes ago. They went to New York yesterday.
Use 3: PAST STATES	
We use past simple to talk about past states:	
E.g. I lived in Cork for 10 years. My grandmother had long blond hair.
