## **News Anchor:**

Facebook's **Oversight**<sup>1</sup> Board has **upheld the decision**<sup>2</sup> to suspend former President Donald Trump. Let's go straight to our US Correspondent Mark Stone.

Mark, what have they said? This has just come in in the last couple of minutes.

## **News Correspondent:**

Yes, just ah, 4 minutes or so ago a decision by the Oversight Board, who operate – funded by Facebook but an independent oversight board, is should be stressed – were asked to **look into**<sup>3</sup> the decision, or asked, indeed, by Donald Trump and his team to look into the decision, to ban him from Facebook – a decision that was made by Facebook's Chief Executive on January the 6<sup>th</sup>, as a consequence of numerous (tweets) posts on Facebook that he had made over the course of several months.

But at what **amounted to<sup>4</sup>** a moment on January 6<sup>th</sup> when we all remember what happened on Capitol Hill here, with the insurrection there, so-called. Donald Trump asked for a review. The review has taken place and the board has upheld Facebook's decision.
