Past Perfect: Use

Use 1: AN ACTION THAT CONTINUES UP TO ANOTHER POINT IN THE PAST	Use 2: TO EMPHASIZE THE DURATION OF A PAST ACTION
We use past perfect continuous to talk about an action that continue up to another action or time in the past:	We use past perfect continuous to emphasize the duration of a past action:
E.g. I had been working for hours before you arrived. He had been training for six months by the time of the race.	E.g. By the time the bus arrived they had been waiting for four hours. We had been looking for the right apartment for many months before we found the right one.
