## Past Perfect: Use

Use 1: AN ACTION THAT CONTINUES UP TO ANOTHER POINT IN THE PAST	Use 2: TO EMPHASIZE THE DURATION OF A PAST ACTION
We use past perfect continuous to talk about an action that continue up to another action or time in the past:	We use past perfect continuous to emphasize the duration of a past action:
E.g. <b>I had been working</b> for hours before you arrived. <b>He had been training</b> for six months by the time of the race.	E.g. By the time the bus arrived <b>they</b> <b>had been waiting</b> for four hours. <b>We had been looking</b> for the right apartment for many months before we found the right one.
